#### **NEW TOPICS**

#### Nature Emergency

- At September's Full Council meeting, <u>Winchester City Council declared a Nature</u>
   <u>Emergency</u> that will sit alongside the Climate Emergency declaration made in 2019.

   Councillor Danny Lee was instrumental in driving through this Nature Emergency declaration.
- The declaration came out shortly before the <u>State of Nature 2023 Report</u> was issued, which highlights that one in six species at now at risk of being lost from Great Britain, and that only one in seven of the habitats assessed during the study were deemed to be in good condition.
- The Council's declaration of a Nature Emergency is a great first step towards putting in place the actions and policies needed to drive real change.

### • The Great British Insulation Scheme

- This new Government scheme will enable up to 300,000 households to add insulation to their homes to make them easier to heat for less.
- The scheme is aimed at two main groups:
  - Those living in homes with an Energy Performance Certificate (EPC) rating D-G and within council tax bands A-D
  - Householders receiving qualifying benefits and living in homes with an EPC rating of D or below.

### • Solar Together Hampshire

- WCC are working with Hampshire County Council to promote a group buying scheme to residents for high-quality solar Photovoltaic (PV) panels and battery storage.
- The scheme will bring Hampshire households together to get high-quality solar panels
  at a competitive price, helping them through the process and keeping them informed at
  every stage. Local residents have the opportunity to invest in generating their own
  electricity to save on their energy bills and lower their carbon footprint by having solar
  panels installed.

## • Recycling Update

- The Council is working to understand the PMs announcement on recycling and the implications for the planned improvements to waste collection in the District.
- It is unclear whether the PMs statement means that the much-delayed plans for consistent household collections and the Deposit Return Scheme have been amended or indeed scrapped.

## Rural England Prosperity Fund

 Another opportunity to get funding form the Rural England Prosperity Fund is opening shortly. This grant scheme will support capital projects for small businesses and community infrastructure, to help to improve productivity and strengthen the rural economy and rural communities.

- In the first tranche, projects receiving funding included Ground Source Heating for Itchen Abbas Village Hall, improving hall equipment for Wickham Community Association and installation of EV charging points for Twyford Parish Council

### **Homeshare**

• St John's Winchester charity has set up a Homeshare scheme to help tackle loneliness and isolation, relieve pressure on housing and the cost-of-living crisis and have a positive effect on the mental and physical wellbeing of older and younger people in Winchester and District. Matches an older homeowner who has a spare room (the 'householder') with a younger person (the 'sharer') who needs affordable accommodation. In exchange for the room, the sharer volunteers 10 hours a week practical help and companionship to the householder. There's a small fee to pay for the service (matching, robust safeguarding checks, on-going monitoring) £100 per month for the householder, £200 per month for the sharer. #### Grants

- Small Grants Scheme The WCC District Small Grant Scheme provides one-off grants of up to £1,000 to local voluntary/not-for-profit groups and organisations for one-off expenditure on projects, equipment, and other items to help organisations to do more, reach more people, or provide better services.

## Going Green Faster & Help with Cost of Living

- Homes Residents can apply for grants of up to £25,000 for energy efficiency improvements to their property under the <u>Warmer Homes</u> program. Homes who are likely to be eligible to receive support:
  - o are low income
  - o are off the gas grid
  - o have an Energy Performance Certificate (EPC) between D and G
